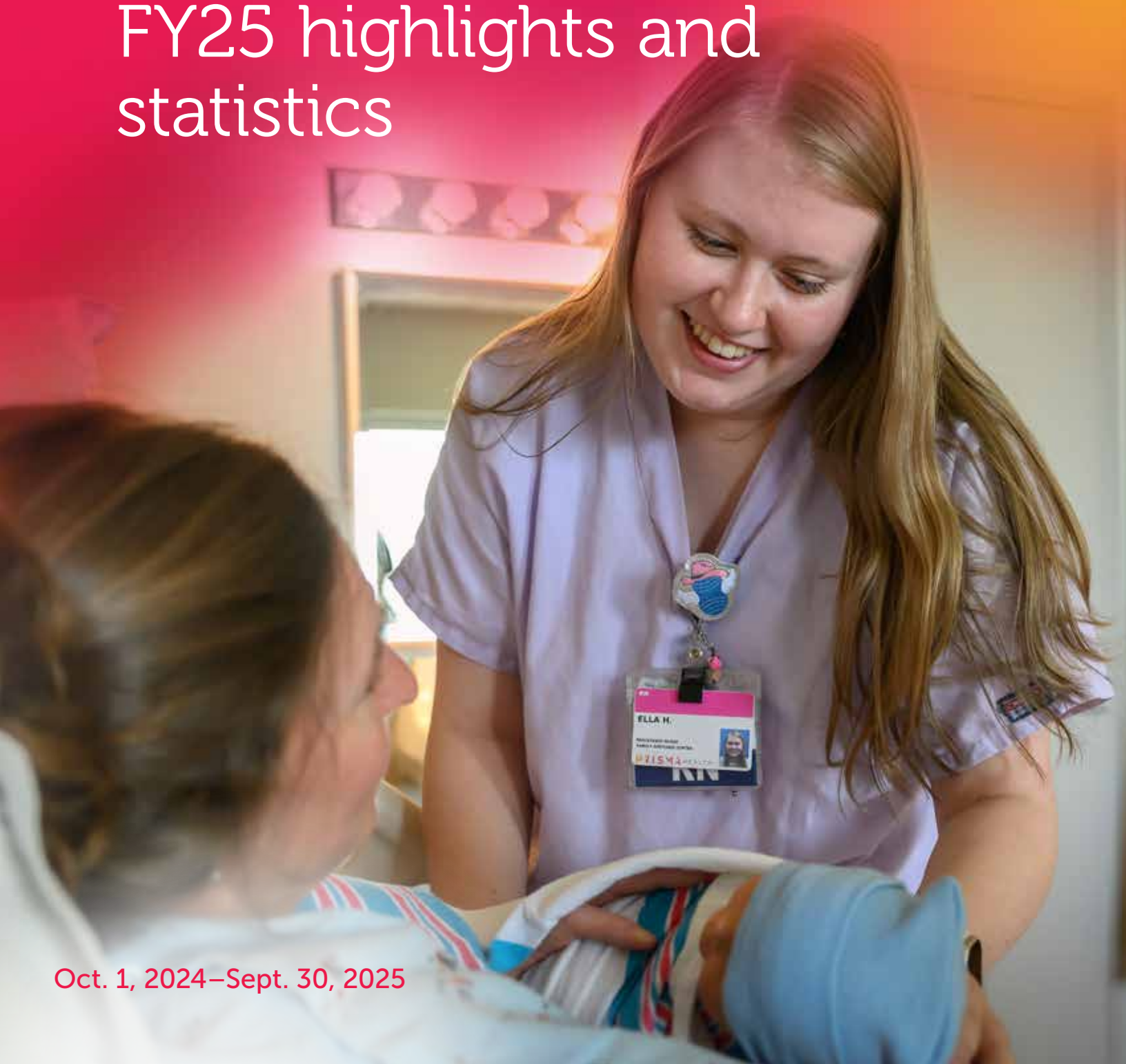

## Community benefit

Prisma Health annually reports our community benefit figures. Net costs of charity and Medicaid services, along with support to the community and community health partners, are reported using guidelines set by the Catholic Health Association.

We also include bad debt and Medicare shortfall figures, as those are taken at a loss to our organization in the interest of providing care to all patients.

The percentage of operating expense recognized as community benefit for our hospitals and medical group in FY25 was 20.1%.

# Blount Memorial Hospital is now part of Prisma Health

## Partnerships

In early FY25, Blount Memorial Hospital, a 304-bed nonprofit community hospital in Maryville, Tennessee, became a part of Prisma Health.

This partnership marks a significant milestone in delivering high-quality, innovative care to East Tennessee while preserving Blount Memorial's longstanding legacy of excellence in patient care and clinical innovation. Notably, Blount Memorial is the first hospital outside South Carolina to join Prisma Health.

As part of this integration, Prisma Health will leverage its scale, innovative technologies and operational efficiencies to support Blount Memorial's ongoing mission of providing excellent care. Together, the organizations are working to advance health care quality, safety and access for patients across the region.





## Programs, services and research highlights

### Midlands

- Prisma Health researchers reached a major milestone as the first in the world to successfully randomize and implant a patient in the groundbreaking TEAM-HF research trial. The trial is a prospective, randomized, open-label study comparing left ventricular assist device (LVAD) therapy to continued guideline-directed medical therapy in non-inotrope-dependent heart failure patients with refractory pulmonary hypertension secondary to left ventricular failure.
- Prisma Health is the first in South Carolina to offer focused ultrasound treatment – a non-invasive, incision-free outpatient procedure that uses MRI-guided high-intensity sound waves to precisely target and ablate the small region of the brain responsible for tremors. This groundbreaking treatment offers minimal risk and maximum precision.
- A quality improvement project to control blood pressure in 10 primary care practices improved hypertension control across the population to prevent an estimated 130 deaths every year.
- Souvik Sen, MD, the lead author of a study that found that people who regularly floss their teeth may lower their risk of stroke, presented the study's abstract at the American Stroke Association's International Stroke Conference.
- Donald Siddoway, MD, and the Heart & Vascular Institute team in the Midlands successfully implanted the first dual chamber, leadless pacemaker for Prisma Health.



## Upstate

- Prisma Health broke ground on a \$138 million inpatient behavioral health hospital in the Upstate.
- Prisma Health Oconee Memorial Hospital opened its new behavioral health emergency care (BHEC) unit to provide specialized care for patients experiencing a psychiatric or substance use disorder crisis.
- Prisma Health opened a new \$32 million outpatient surgery center in the Upstate, offering easy access and convenience for patients having same-day discharge procedures.
- Prisma Health Transplant Center launched its liver transplant program, expanding local accessibility to lifesaving treatment. The center completed 134 kidney and pancreas transplants and 10 liver transplants in FY25.
- Prisma Health now offers advanced diagnostic and therapeutic endoscopic ultrasound (EUS) at the Gastroenterology and Liver Center–Greenville to provide detailed imaging and minimally invasive treatment for complex gastrointestinal and pancreatic conditions.
- Prisma Health Cancer Institute is leading one of the largest cancer prevention trials in our region. With more than 1,000 participants already enrolled, the Prevent Cancer Greenville study is a groundbreaking effort aimed at identifying risk factors and stopping cancer before it starts.
- An article written by Center for Family Medicine–Greenville physicians Joel Amidon, MD, Stephen Carek, MD, and Joy Shen-Wagner, MD – “Diagnosing Common Benign Skin Tumors” – has been selected as Article of the Year by American Family Physician.



## Tennessee

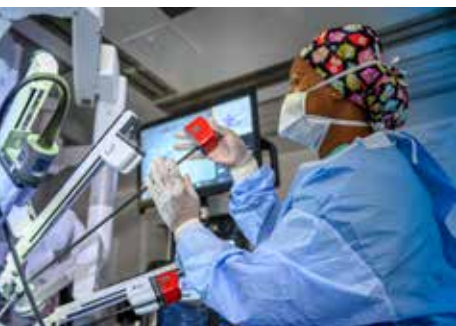
- Prisma Health Blount Memorial Hospital went live with Epic, the electronic medical record system, which provides patients and providers with a significantly enhanced health care experience and collection of medical records in one location. Patients also gained access to MyChart, which puts all health record information and the ability to communicate directly with providers at patients' fingertips.





## Expansions

### System



- Prisma Health expanded access to robotic-assisted surgery across all its hospitals, bringing advanced surgical care closer to home for patients throughout South Carolina.
- Prisma Health launched the Sickle Cell Lifespan Center, a newly expanded, systemwide program that provides comprehensive, multidisciplinary care for patients with sickle cell disease – from childhood diagnosis through adulthood. With dedicated clinics in Greenville and Columbia, the center ensures seamless continuation of care and access to advanced treatments.
- Eight Prisma Health Urgent Care locations opened in this fiscal year, bringing the total to 24.

### Midlands



- Prisma Health Neurology–Taylor St. increased its clinical footprint from eight to 20 exam rooms with a move to 1301 Taylor Street, Suite 7A.
- Prisma Health Cardiology–Chapin opened with six exam rooms, on-site echo, EKG and stress testing, as well as device checking. It shares a suite with Prisma Health Family Medicine–Chapin at the Prisma Health Medical Park.
- MedEx Academy has expanded into the Midlands. This one-of-a-kind program helps high school and college students experience various health care careers – increasing the number of health care providers in South Carolina and making employment opportunities more accessible to a diverse group of students.

## Upstate

- Prisma Health tripled patient access to outpatient behavioral health services in the Upstate with the opening of its \$3.7 million Behavioral Health & Wellness Pavilion featuring adult programs specializing in behavioral health and substance use disorders, a groundbreaking mother-infant wellness program for women suffering from depression and anxiety disorders during pregnancy and postpartum, and an adolescent behavioral health disorders program and eating disorders program.
- Prisma Health Children’s Hospital–Upstate opened its \$7.5 million expanded Pediatric Hematology Oncology unit that offers increased bed capacity and a healing environment for children with cancer and blood disorders. It features a day treatment area, playroom, family respite area and a space created for end-of-life care.
- Prisma Health Carolina Cardiology Consultants–Patewood opened with 12 exam rooms, four physician touch-down areas and four clinical workstations.
- With partner Clemson University, Prisma Health introduced a 3T functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI) machine at Oconee Memorial Hospital. The next-generation, non-invasive scanning technology provides faster, higher quality medical imaging and supports local clinical diagnostic needs for patients and expands research opportunities to study Alzheimer’s disease and related conditions.
- To strengthen health care access in rural areas, Advanced Family Medicine–Clinton added more exam rooms and underwent extensive renovations. The practice plans to add a physician to help it further expand access and provide more high-quality primary care close to home.
- Prisma Health announced that it is beginning work on a \$350 million expansion at Greer Memorial Hospital.
- Prisma Health announced an expansion of orthopedic services in Laurens County – including the addition of freestanding offices for its orthopedics practice and supporting outpatient therapies – as part of an approximately \$2 million project.



## Tennessee

- Prisma Health Blount Memorial Hospital opened a Fast Track area in its Emergency Department to help move patients with less acute conditions through more quickly and support capacity needs for a growing Blount County.
- Prisma Health Total Rehabilitation opened a new clinic in Madisonville, which offers personalized care for patients of all ages, helping them to regain strength, mobility and independence after an illness or injury with physical therapy, neurological therapy, vestibular therapy and more.
- Prisma Health Total Rehabilitation–Fairview added six treatment rooms and expanded the gym for patients in the growing West Maryville area, allowing for increased access to rehabilitation services.



## Awards and recognitions

### System



- Prisma Health received the NRC Health® Excellence in Patient Experience Award.
- Prisma Health was recognized as a national Platinum Workplace Well-being employer by Aetna, celebrating comprehensive strategies in emotional, physical, financial and whole life wellness.
- Forbes magazine recognized Prisma Health as one of South Carolina's best employers in 2025 and one of America's Best Employers for Tech Workers.
- Prisma Health has been named to Fortune's 2025 list of America's Most Innovative Companies – one of only 36 health systems recognized in the nation and the only one in South Carolina.
- Prisma Health Greenville Memorial Hospital and Richland Hospital have been named Best Regional Hospital in the Greenville and Columbia Metro areas, respectively, according to the U.S. News and World Report Best Hospitals Rankings. Additionally, Richland Hospital was named a Best Regional Hospital for Community Access.
- Prisma Health also was ranked as high performing in several other specialties and procedures, including cardiology, cancer and orthopedics. High-performing hospitals fall in the top 10% of hospitals analyzed for this report, according to U.S. News and World Report. Prisma Health hospitals and specialties recognized by U.S. News and World Report include:
  - Baptist Hospital – high performing in knee replacement, hip replacement, colon cancer surgery, gynecological cancer.
  - Baptist Parkridge – high performing in spinal fusion.
  - Greenville Memorial Hospital – tied for top Metro Hospital and ranked fifth among hospitals in the state, and high performing in abdominal aortic aneurysm repair, colon cancer surgery, gynecological cancer, heart attacks, leukemia, lymphoma and myeloma, prostate cancer surgery, stroke, transcatheter aortic valve replacement and pacemaker implantation.
  - Patewood Hospital – high performing in knee replacement, hip replacement; high performing in obstetrics and gynecology.
  - Richland Hospital – ranked second Metro Hospital and ninth among all hospitals in the state, and high performing in congestive heart failure, gynecological cancer, heart attack, kidney failure, lung cancer surgery, stroke, transcatheter aortic valve replacement and pacemaker implantation.
  - Tuomey Hospital – high performing in kidney failure.
- Eleven Prisma Health hospitals earned top honors from the American Heart Association's Get With The Guidelines®–Stroke program. Greenville Memorial Hospital received the Target: Stroke Honor Roll Elite Plus designation, the program's highest level of recognition. This distinction is rare, with only a select



number of hospitals nationwide achieving it. Altogether, Prisma Health brought home 14 American Heart Association achievement awards.

- ECRI, a global independent health care and patient safety nonprofit, named Prisma Health the winner of its 2025 Health Technology Excellence Award. The award was based on the success of its multi-layered, comprehensive approach to advancing its technology infrastructure and disaster preparedness while enhancing patient safety and care delivery.
- The Prisma Health Pharmacy team received the 2025 Pharmacy Compounding Excellence Award from Premier, Inc. This national award recognizes hospital systems that excel in safely preparing customized medications, especially when standard treatments aren't available and finding innovative ways to improve care and respond to industry challenges.
- The Palmetto Gold Nurse Recognition and Scholarship Program honoring South Carolina registered nurses named 16 Prisma Health nurses as Palmetto Gold recipients, caregivers who exemplify excellence in nursing practice and commitment to the profession.

## Midlands

- Baptist Hospital received the Vizient Quality and Accountability Performance Award and the Vizient Quality Leadership Award.
- Tuomey Hospital received the SHSC's Hope Hero Award. SHSC is Sharing Hope, South Carolina's federally designated organ procurement organization, and it gave the award based on Tuomey's commitment to donation and for the "above-and-beyond, collaborative work" team members provided for an organ donor case that involved a variety of significant challenges.
- Meera Narasimhan, MD, received a James E. Clyburn Health Equity Healthcare Leadership Award in recognition of her many contributions and commitment to improving access and protecting the health of the communities in South Carolina over the past 20 years.
- Shilpa Srinivasan, MD, was named the 2025 recipient of the Jeanne Jackson-Siegal Clinician of the Year Award from the American Association for Geriatric Psychiatry to recognize her delivery of quality psychiatric care to older adults and commitment to the field of geriatric psychiatry.
- Christopher Mazoue, MD, was elected as president of the South Carolina Orthopedic Association.





## Upstate

- Greenville Memorial and Hillcrest hospitals were named to the Premier 100 Top Hospitals program list, which recognizes top performing hospitals and health care systems based on clinical, operational, and financial strengths and patient perception. Greenville Memorial Hospital also earned the Everest Award, a special subgroup of 100 Top Hospitals recipients that have been further recognized for achieving a top rate of improvement.
- The Surgical Trauma ICU (STICU) of Greenville Memorial Hospital earned the Beacon Award for Excellence from the American Association of Critical-Care Nurses (AACN).
- Healthgrades recognized Greenville Memorial Hospital for being among America's 250 Best Hospitals.
- Greer Memorial Hospital was recognized by Healthgrades with the following: Patient Safety Excellence Award, GI Surgery Excellence Award, America's 100 Best Hospitals for GI Care.
- Baptist Easley Hospital received the Pulmonary Care Excellence Award from Healthgrades.
- Patewood Hospital was recognized by Healthgrades with the following: Patient Safety Excellence Award, Joint Replacement Excellence Award, America's 50 Best Hospitals for Outpatient Joint Replacement Award, America's 50 Best Hospitals for Outpatient Orthopedic Surgery Award.
- Hillcrest Hospital received Vizient's Bernard Birnbaum Quality Leadership Award.



- Oconee Memorial Hospital's Emergency Department was the only South Carolina ED to earn the Lantern Award by the Emergency Nurses Association. This national recognition celebrates emergency departments that demonstrate exceptional leadership, practice, education, advocacy and research performance.
- Ashley Smith, nurse manager of Cardiac Telemetry and the Rapid Assessment Unit at Oconee Memorial Hospital, is this year's national recipient of the Extraordinary Nurse in Patient Safety Award, chosen by the DAISY Foundation and the Institute for Health Improvement.
- A Hillcrest Hospital clinical engineering team member received a Pinnacle Award from Philips Healthcare.
- Ryan Hakimi, DO, was elected president of the American Society of Neuroimaging.
- Kyle Jeray, MD, was confirmed as the 138th president of the American Orthopaedic Association.



## Tennessee

- Physical therapist assistant Adam Burgess received the 2025 Outstanding Physical Therapist Assistant Award from the American Physical Therapy Association Tennessee.
- Certified athletic trainer Peggy Bratt was inducted into the Southeast Athletic Trainers' Association (SEATA) Hall of Fame, selected on the basis of the quality of care she provides, her leadership and professionalism.
- Physical therapist Joe Black from Prisma Health Total Rehabilitation was elected secretary of the ICCUS Society, an international group of clinicians, educators and researchers who are among the most experienced and well-respected practitioners in sports rehabilitation.



## Accreditations, certifications, designations

### System

- Baptist Parkridge Hospital was recognized by the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Magnet for its second designation as a Magnet® organization, with the added credential "with Distinction" – the highest national honor for professional nursing practice. Other Prisma Health hospitals holding Magnet status are Baptist, Greenville Memorial, Greer Memorial, Oconee Memorial and Richland.
- Prisma Health has more Leapfrog A hospitals than any health system in South Carolina, and only two health systems in the United States have more Leapfrog Top Hospitals than Prisma Health.
- Baptist Parkridge Hospital was redesignated a Baby Friendly Hospital, joining Baptist, Greenville Memorial, Greer Memorial, Oconee Memorial, Patewood, Richland and Tuomey hospitals in that designation.
- Baptist and Oconee Memorial hospitals were certified as Primary Stroke Centers; Greer Memorial, Hillcrest and Laurens County hospitals were recertified; Tuomey Hospital received Disease Specific Certification as a Primary Stroke Center; Greenville Memorial Hospital was recertified as a Comprehensive Stroke Center.
- BlueCross BlueShield Blue Distinction Centers (BDC) are designations awarded every three years. Richland Hospital was recognized as a Maternity Blue Distinction Center, joining Baptist, Greenville Memorial, Greer Memorial, Oconee Memorial and Patewood hospitals in this status. Hillcrest Hospital was recognized as a BDC for Bariatric Surgery.
- All 12 South Carolina Prisma Health hospitals collected a total of 50 Certified Zero Harm Awards given by the S.C. Hospital Association in 2025. These safety milestones focus on protecting patients by preventing hospital-acquired infections. The system also received four awards for Drive to Zero Suicide and 11 Drive to Zero Workplace Violence awards. Baptist and Patewood hospitals earned the Zero Harm Maternal Health Award (two of only seven hospitals in the state to earn this distinction). Blount Memorial Hospital earned eight Zero Harm Awards from the Tennessee Hospital Association.



## Midlands

- Hospice of the Foothills has received a 5-star rating for Family Caregiver Experience from Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

## Upstate

- Greenville Memorial Hospital was redesignated as a Level I Adult Trauma Center and a Level II Pediatric Trauma Center.
- Patewood Hospital was certified for primary shoulder replacement and for advanced hip and knee replacement by Joint Commission.
- Roger C. Peace Rehabilitation Hospital earned reaccreditation across 10 programs by CARF International (Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities).

## Tennessee

- Prisma Health Blount Memorial Hospital is the first site to earn Chest Pain Center Accreditation with Primary PCI using the streamlined model of the American College of Cardiology.
- The Cardiac Cath Lab at Blount Memorial Hospital was accredited by the American College of Cardiology.
- The Prisma Health Sleep Center was recognized for attaining and maintaining accreditation from the American Academy of Sleep Medicine for 15 consecutive years.
- Blount Memorial Hospital has been re-accredited and is recognized as a Comprehensive Center by The American College of Surgeons (ACS) Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery Accreditation and Quality Improvement Program.

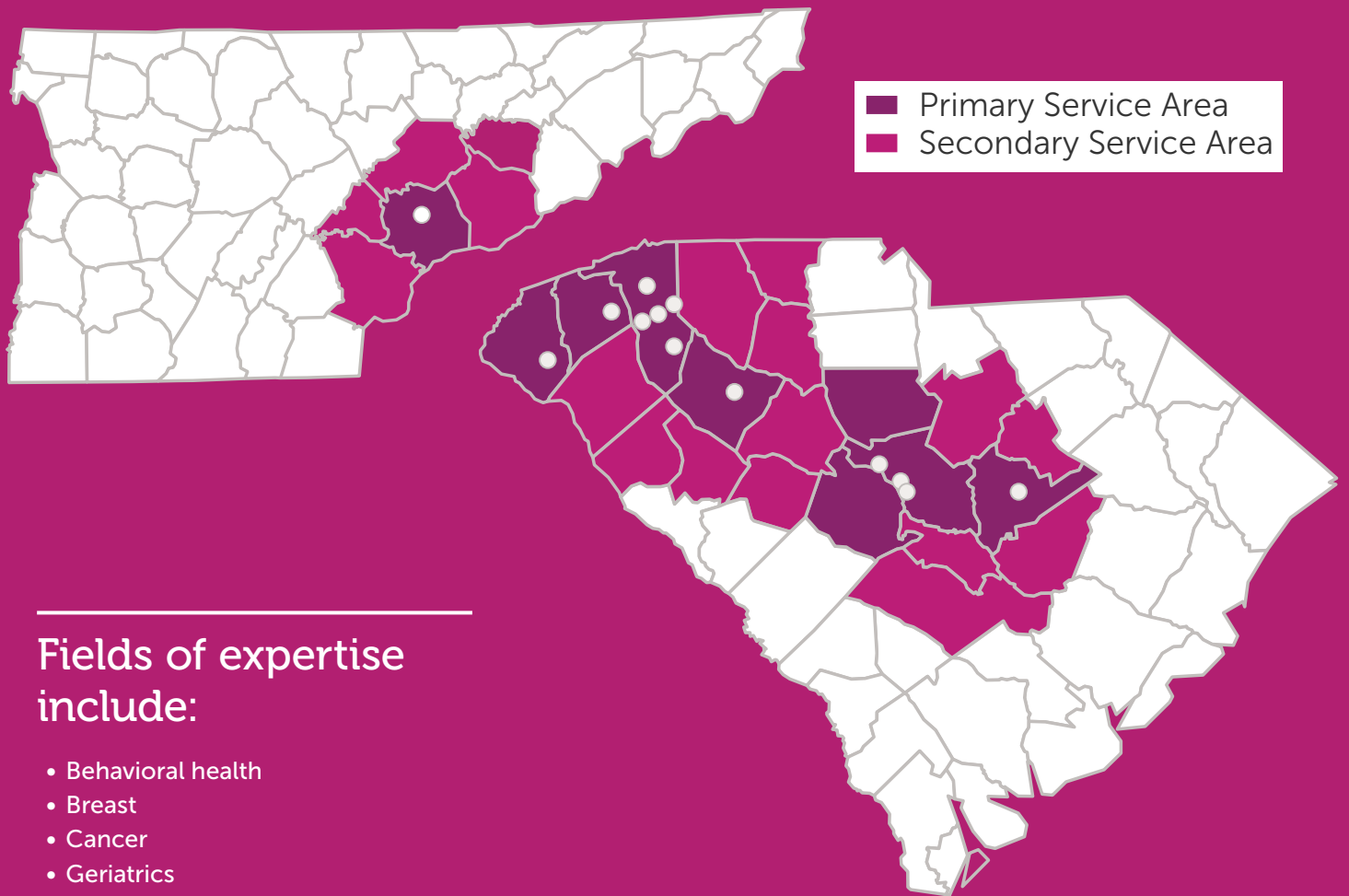
